

DENISE WILLIAMS

Denise Williams (BSc, MA, ARCT, RMT) is a professional singer, music educator and facilitator. She holds an ARCT in Singing Performance from the Royal Conservatory of Music, a Masters in Community Music from Wilfrid Laurier University, and has studied Arts and Entertainment Administration at Rverson University. Her 30+ year international solo performance career has put her at home on the concert, opera, and theatre stages, working with, to name a few national companies, The Nathaniel Dett Chorale, The Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Toronto Mendelssohn Choir, Mirvish Productions, Eastern Front Theatre, Theatre Northwest as well as international appearances. Denise's self-created and selfproduced, Walk Together Children, is a concert programming of Black and Jewish music intersections, which has had various presentations for over 20 years. This program has been awarded an OAC grant for its 2023 presentation with the Jubilate Singers and many fine Black, Jewish, and Muslim artists.

Denise has participated in international symposiums, particularly addressing cross-cultural sharing of music traditions involving the African Diaspora.


Aware that education is essential to social transformation, Andrea McLean has spent many years working with young people in schools and community contexts. Her work experience with children and youth includes the Centre for Learning in Haiti, the Training and Transformation (CAFT), the School of Nations in British Guyana. She is currently completing a diploma in Montessori Education - Early Childhood and working toward completing a Royal Conservatory of Music Associate Diploma (ARCT) in Singing. As a young adult, Andrea founded Nancy Campbell Academy Children's Theatre Workshop and coordinated and performed at Art and Soul fundraisers in partnership with the Steven Louis Foundation in London Ontario. She travelled throughout the north, central, and south Americas as a dance theatre performer and workshop facilitator contributing to social transformation and community development.

Andrea's commitment to working with children is commendable. She believes that each child has the capacity and potential to engage meaningfully through exposure to and acquisition of various art forms.

In 2006, **W. Ian Walker** formed his company Emlian Communications Group. Mr. Walker holds a BA in Theatre and Film from McMaster University, and a Post-Graduate Certificate in Fundraising and Volunteer Management from Humber College, Toronto. Ian is a recipient of the Imperial Oil Scholarship to the Banff School of Management, Development for Arts Administrators Seminar.

For 40 years, Mr. Walker has been passionate about being a vocalist, chorister and Arts Administrator in choral or orchestra management requirements. He has worked for Orchestra London, London Pro Musica and formerly The London International Children's Festival, Toronto Mendelssohn Youth Choir and TMC organization, the Elmer Iseler Singers and the Orpheus Choir of Toronto as their Director of Marketing and Development. Since the release of Walker's book "Stirring My Soul to Sing, Overcoming ADHD Through Song" (published in 2018) his book is now well received internationally.

In July 2022, lan's redeveloped some characters from his book into a one-hour dramatic ADHD play. "Stirring My Soul to Sing-The Play". As an active speaker, author, ADHD and podcast host, lan still loves to consult on arts and fundraising projects when his schedule will allow.

MANY VOICES, MANY STORIES





Beyond enriching the Canadian arts community with novel stories, this program also professionally develops the next generation of Canadian emerging artists, writers, and backstage personnel. Each year, No Strings Theatre selects a destination theme for our programming.

In our inaugural year, we chose the destination of the Caribbean by presenting "Dario et La Diablesse" by Sasky Louison and Darryl Joseph-Dennie, a musical twist on Caribbean folklore directed by Dora Mavor award winner, Richardo Keens-Douglas!

Presently we recognize that the world has undergone centuries of cultural intersections. At this time in our history, we both celebrate the richness of the artistic fusions and also must reconcile that the products of these fusions have not always benefitted all.

With No Strings Theatre's commitment to fostering anti-racist, non-biased theatrical practices, we re-imagined our programming to encourage a new and progressive approach to our future stages, we unveiled our "Many Voices, Many Stories" programming in 2021.





This past season, as society continues to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, we focused on mental health through theatrical therapy workshops by Colleen Taffe and the development of an Emerging Artist's musical based on seasonal affective disorder, "The Storyteller" book, music and lyrics by Kathleen Mills.





WORKSHOPS AND DISCUSSIONS FOCUSING ON SOCIAL DISCOURSE

Over the past two years, we have hosted discussions with seasoned Black artists and Black emerging artists to discuss their experiences and outlook in the performing arts.

SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM FOR EMERGING ARTISTS

The pandemic has made it difficult for many performing artists to continue pursuing their dreams. Because of the support from our generous donors, we were able to offer two scholarships to support Black identifying students at Sheridan College and McGill University.

No Strings Theatre intends to continue supporting equity-deserving emerging artists to support their work in achieving their artistic dreams.









AFFILIATE PROGRAMMING

Witnessing the impact that we have made on many youths and our emerging artists' successes, we feel that it is even more important for us to provide subsidized programming for an increasingly diverse community, recognizing the increased need to foster equality in our society. We were pleased to provide fully subsidized instruction voice, singing/songwriting, musicianship in the 2021 - 2022 season through programs such as Acting Through Song.


BLACK ON STAGE - TAKE 2

In response to our community's continued desire to further understand ways to bridge gaps in achieving equitable performance practices, No Strings Theatre built upon our panel discussion from last year with seasoned Black artists. In the 2021-2022 season, No Strings Theatre invited a panel of Black Emerging Artists to share their experiences in the musical theatre industry and how the industry can keep moving forward.

Welcoming the 2021 holiday season, our annual fundraising event hosted a winter wonderland of classical style, jazz musicians, soul and theatre with keys, sax, bass, drums, steel pan, and voice, honouring Stephen Sondheim, Stevie Wonder, Roberta Flack, Mark Hayes, Jester Hairston and others. The concert featured Juno Award winner Carlos Morgan, Broadway singer/songwriter Michelle Willis, and many NST alumni! The venue for this event was at 'A Different Booklist Cultural Centre' known as 'The Blackhurst Cultural Centre', our pending venue partners.

THERAPEUTIC THEATRE WORKSHOPS

To aid creators and audiences emerge from the psychological/emotional throws of the Covid lockdown, NST hosted a free 3-part Therapeutic workshop series designed to balance emotions, feelings and expressions, towards unleashing creativity and holistic wellness given by mental health and addiction specialist, playwright, director, actor and producer, Colleen Taffe.



SHEIK AND SATER'S SPRING AWAKENING

Licensed Book musical Spring Awakening by Duncan Sheik and Steven Sater (which is having a resurgence on Broadway again), is a coming of age musical that depicts subjects related to religion, sex, abuse, suicide and other traumatic coming of age experiences.

W. A. MOZART'S LE NOZZE DI FIGARO

This was NST's inaugural Summer Opera in collaboration with William Shookhoff's *Opera by Request*. Director Gregory Finney and NST's summer intern and Associate Director, Anthony Goncherov, gave W. Mozart's The Marriage of Figaro, masterpiece a delightful outdoor contemporary spin in English and Italian, at a farm in the Caledon area near Orangeville. This engaged established repetiteur mentors, a cast, and audiences from within the GTA as well as in the neighbouring rural areas.




MALTON BLACK DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION-BLACK EXCELLENCE IN SCHOOLS PROGRAM

No Strings Theatre partnered with the Malton Black Development Association to create a a multi-disciplined arts program for middle school black youths identified as at risk. Denise Williams spearheaded this program and gathered a team of professional established black artists to deliver 25 hrs of arts programming (music, visual arts, creative writing, and dance) to the youths, focusing on 'The Nutmeg Princess', by the awardwinning Caribbean-Canadian, Richardo-Keens Douglas.
