Our Story:

Founded by Denise Williams in 2005, No Strings Theatre was born out of a need to address systemic exclusion in arts education. Through accessible training, paid performance opportunities, and equity-centered programming, NST creates pathways for emerging artists to thrive-no strings attached. NST has since supported 200+ artists across Canada, many of whom have gone on to national and international careers.

What:

• Adjala Township, rural Ontario

Who It Serves:

- Emerging and re-emerging artists (esp. BIPOC and low-income)
- Rural communities hungry for cultural access
- Youth chorus and interns from diverse backgrounds

Why It Matters:

- Opera shouldn't only live in Toronto.
- Talent shouldn't only come from privilege.
- This program proves both.

Sparky the Musical

What:

• A new Canadian musical based on the beloved book by Caribbean-Canadian author Richardo Keens-Douglas

Themes:

• Belonging, difference, resilience – told through the story of a firefly born without a light

Impact:

- 750+ youth and families reached
- Led by a professional Black creative team
- Empowers diverse narratives for children
- Adds a joyful new work to the Canadian canon

- Pay-what-you-can options and Black History Month engagement


